(A) Cork shooting gallery. This rule applies to Gamesgames using wooden-type targets or a shoot until you win game or a game giving a prize every time. shall athere to this futle. The operator of these style games shall ensure:Guns
(1) Guns shallbeare in good mechanical condition-; Nochippedor erookedeorks are permitted. The target shelf shall notexeed forr inehes in width. No obstrtetion shall interfere with the prize target falling off the target shelf. No target shall be used which patrons eannot shoot off the shelf. All targets afe to be placed the same distanee from the counter or "foul line." Paper soft drink eups shall not be used as targets. Targets shall be uniform in size, shape, and weight. No prize shall be attached to the targets. Games giving a prize when obtaining the ebject with a limited number of shots shall athere to this rute.
(2) Chipped or crooked corks are not in use;
(3) The target shelf does not exceed four inches in width;
(4) Obstructions are not allowed to interfere with the prize target falling off the target shelf;
(5) No target is allowed to be used which patrons cannot shoot off the shelf;
(6) All targets are placed the same distance from the counter or "foul line":
(7) All cups are uniform in the type of material they are made of; and
(8) Prizes are not attached to the targets.
(B) Long range, flip, or sling-shot galleries. The operator of these style games shall ensure:The
(1) The guns shall be-are attached to the counter in a manner to protect the public-; Lead galleries shalluse nen-splatter bullets only. Galleries shall have good side and baek wall protection at all times. Galleries shall be operated for ammement enly unless otherwise speeified.
(2) Only non-splatter bullets are used in lead galleries;
(3) Galleries always have good side and back wall protection; and
(4) Unless otherwise specified, galleries will be operated for amusement only.
(C) Can shooting gallery. The operator of these style games shall ensure:This
(1) This game shall beis played with different sized beverage cans-; The shall be empty and devoid of any matter. The object of the game shall be toknoek over two or more eans of a matehing size. No prizes shall be attached to the eans. Im all eases, all of the eans must be able to be knocked over.
(2) The cans are empty and devoid of any matter;
(3) The object of the game is to knock over two or more cans of a matching size;
(4) Only non-splatter bullets are use in lead galleries;
(5) Prizes are not attached to the cans; and
(6) All of the cans are able to be knocked over.
(D) Shoot out the star games. These games may be lieensed by the department which shall establish standards under whieh the games shalloperate. Sueh standards may inelude, but shall not be limited to The operator of these style games shall ensure:
(1) The size of the star to be shot out mast beis no greater than one and one-quarter inches-;
(2) The targets are be-approximately nine feet from the gun muzzle-;
(3) Each load is to be at least one hundred shots:;
(4) All guns mest be are chained down to prevent them from being turned toward the player or midway:;
(5) All stars are on seventy-pound velum paper as approved by the department-;
(6) Only non-splatter bullets are used in lead galleries;
( $(7)$ (7) Manufacturer's verification is requireton all paper targets:; and
$(7)(8)$ The guns shalloperateoperating on pressure have between one hundred twentyfive to one hundred fifty pounds of air pressure.
(E) Archery. The operator of these style games shall ensure:The
(1) operator of this game shall provideThere is a protective covering on three sides-; If the state inspeetor and/or a representative of the fair boad determines a eovering must also be ereeted across the top toprotect the publie, streheovering shall be required. The department has the right to require the operator to ehain
the deviee to the eounter so as to make it impossible to shoot other than towards the target.
(2) A covering will be erected across the top to protect the public if the state inspector and/or a representative of the fair board determines one is needed; and
(3) The device is chained to the counter to prevent the ability to shoot in any other direction other than towards the target, if required by the department.
