- Payrolls Prepared by Data Processing Method Allows the Director of the Department of Administrative Services to develop methods for controlling input and verifying output of electronic data processing for payroll and for the special audit of such methods.
- 123:1-35-05 Mandatory Direct Deposit of Compensation for Certain Employees Establishes the procedures and parameters for employees that are required to have their compensation directly deposited into a financial institution.
