

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 119.03, notice is hereby given that the Department of Administrative Services intends to conduct a public hearing for the purpose of amending Ohio Administrative Code Sections 123:1-39-01 and 123:1-41-08 and rescinding Ohio Administrative Code 123:1-41-03.

The proposed to be amended rules deals with the following subject matter:

- 123:1-39-01: Professional Development Fund – To remove the computer purchase program from the covered programs.
- 123:1-41-08: Verification of Retention Points – To limit the verification of retention points to only those positions that are in the service of the state and to correct a typographical error

The proposed to be rescinded rule deals with the following subject matter:

- 123:1-41-03: Determination of lack of funds or lack of work for county offices, and state-supported colleges and universities and the filing of a statement of rationale and supporting information.

The Department of Administrative Services shall hold a public hearing on the proposed rule amendments and adoption on Monday, January 4, 2010, at 8:30 a.m. in Room 2793, on the 27th floor of the James A. Rhodes State Office Tower located at 30 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio. At this hearing, any person affected by the rule may appear and be heard in person, by the person's attorney, or both, may present the person's position, arguments, or contentions orally or in writing, offer and examine witnesses, and present evidence that tends to show that the rule, if adopted or effectuated, will be unreasonable or unlawful.
