## **PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE**

## ASSISTED LIVING PROGRAM: MEDICAID-FUNDED COMPONENT

ODA proposes to amend rule 173-38-03 of the Administrative Code. ODA's proposals to amend this rule will result in amending approximately more than 50% of the rule, so ODA proposes to rescind the rule and to adopt a new rule in its place to comply with the 50% guideline in §4.3.1 of LSC's Rule Drafting Manual. In doing so, ODA proposes to achieve the following:

- 1. The rule requires ODA's designee to collect the individual's handwritten or electronic signature as an agreement to continue as an enrollee in the program. To allow for social distancing during the COVID-19 public health emergency, ODA added a provision to paragraph (D) of this rule to allow collecting this signature at a later date. ODA now proposes to limit this flexibility to emergencies declared by the governor or a federal public health emergency.
- 2. During the COVID-19 public health emergency, ODA added a provision to paragraph (C)(1)(a)(v)(b)of this rule to allow a person to enroll in the program while temporarily living in a non-compliant resident unit under specific conditions. By the time this rule takes effect, the two remaining enrollees living in non-compliant units will no longer be using this provision. ODA now proposes to remove it from this rule.
- ODA proposes to continue requiring an ODA-approved enrollment agreement, but to no longer require using form ODA1044.
- 4. To comply with R.C. §§ 106.03, 121.95, and 121.951, ODA proposes to reduce the use of regulatory restriction words (e.q., shall) in this rule. This accounts for a majority of the amendments to this rule.
