

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Ohio Department of Public Safety, Ohio State Highway Patrol, will conduct a public hearing for the purpose of soliciting comments on the following proposed changes to Chapter 4501:2-10, "Law Enforcement Automated Data System (LEADS)," of the Ohio Administrative Code:

Proposed for amendment:

4501:2-10-01 (Definitions) – This rule defines terminology used in Chapter 4501:2-10. Proposed changes define new terms "DMVPN," "N-DEx," and "LEADS Mobile";

4501:2-10-06 (Dissemination and record keeping) - This rule establishes the requirements for disseminating LEADS throughput and expectations for LEADS related record keeping. Proposed changes update content to reflect procedural changes;

4501:2-10-12 (Fees for participation in LEADS) - This rule establishes the fee and payment process for agencies participating in LEADS. Proposed changes add mobile application access and "DMVPN-based terminal access" as new LEADS service offerings that organizations may choose to use.

Proposed for rescission and simultaneous adoption under the same rule number due to the Legislative Service Commission's fifty percent guideline:

4501:2-10-04 (LEADS points of contact) – This rule establishes the required points of contact for agencies participating in LEADS and N-DEx and sets forth the expectations for said contacts. Proposed changes from current rule strike paragraphs (A1) to (A)(2) and (B1) to (B)(2), and add N-DEx agency coordinator and NTAC responsibility to reflect procedural changes that resulted from the FBI's decision to retire originating agency identifiers for private entities in Ohio providing technical services to criminal justice agencies.

Any persons affected by the proposed adoption of these rules may appear at the hearing and be heard in person, or by an attorney, or both, or may present their position, argument, or contention in writing. Persons may offer and examine witnesses and present evidence to show that the proposed rules will be unreasonable or unlawful if enacted.
