Pursuant to sections 5101.80 and 5107.05 and Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code, the director of the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services gives notice of the department's intent to consider the adoption, amendment, or rescission of the rule or rules as identified below and of a public hearing thereon.

Rule 5101:1-23-20, entitled: <u>Ohio works first: income and eligibility</u>, is being proposed for rescission and adoption to incorporate "plain language" and to allow clients the choice of either claiming fifty percent of the gross self-employment profit or the use of actual expenses for the Ohio Works First (OWF) program. This rule sets forth the definitions of income, availability and exploration of income, calculation of benefits, and the standards in the OWF program.

Rule 5101:1-23-20.1, entitled: <u>Ohio works first: excluded income</u>, is being proposed for adoption to incorporate "plain language" and is replacing parts of rescinded rule 5101:1-23-20 regarding types of excluded income for the OWF program. This new rule sets forth the types of excluded income for OWF.

Rule 5101:1-23-20.2, entitled: <u>Ohio works first: allocation of income</u>, is being proposed for adoption to incorporate "plain language" and is replacing parts of rescinded rule 5101:1-23-20 regarding allocation of income for the OWF program. This new rule sets forth the process on when and how to allocate income for OWF.
