Rule 5101:3-41-12 entitled Prior authorization requirements for waiver services administered by the Ohio department of mental retardation and developmental disabilities is being proposed for amendment. The purpose of this rule is to establish standards and procedures for prior authorization of waiver services when the individual funding level exceeds the funding range determined by the Ohio developmental disabilities profile (ODDP) for medicaid waiver services administered pursuant to section 5111.871 of the Revised Code. The procedures set forth in this rule shall only apply to the Individual Options program authorized by rule 5101:3-40-01 of the Administrative Code and shall not apply to services administered as part of the "Level One" waiver authorized by rule 5101:3-42-01 of the Administrative Code.
