

## **Public Notice**

Pursuant to section 119.03 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services will hold a public hearing for the purpose of accepting testimony on the proposed changes to the Ohio Administrative Code rules 5122-29-09.

This rule sets forth the requirements of the residential and withdrawal management substance use disorder services. The rule is being amended to add programmatic details regarding the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) residential levels of care. This is being done in support of the substance use disorder 1115 waiver between the Center for Medicaid and Medicare Services (CMS) and the Ohio Department of Medicaid (ODM). The public hearing will be held January 11, 2022 at 9:00 a.m., in Room 3602 of the Rhodes State Office Tower located at 30 East Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215, 36<sup>th</sup> Floor. At this hearing, OhioMHAS will accept verbal and written testimony on the rules under consideration. The hearing will be conducted in accordance with Chapter 119 of the Revised Code. Any person affected by the rules may appear and be heard in person, by his attorney, or both, may present his position, arguments, or contentions, orally or in writing, offer and examine witnesses, and present evidence tending to show that the rules, if adopted or effectuated, will be unreasonable or unlawful.
