<u>Rule 5160-40-01</u>: entitled <u>Medicaid home and community-based services program-individual</u> <u>options waiver</u>. This rule sets forth the program requirements and covered benefits of the Individual Options (IO) HCBS waiver program, as administered by DODD. This rule is being amended to reflect proposed changes to the IO waiver application, for a target effective date of 1/1/2019. The amendment is a culmination of work undertaken by DODD with internal and external stakeholders to add and modify services to the IO benefit package. Proposed new services include Assistive Technology and Community Transition Services; modified services include Remote Monitoring, Remote Monitoring Equipment and the sub-component Assistive Technology Assessment, under the Career Planning Service. In addition to the modified benefit package, this rule also was revised to provide clarification, rule reference corrections, and language edits.

<u>**Rule 5160-41-17:**</u> entitled <u>Medicaid home and community-based services program-selfempowered life funding waiver.</u> This rule sets forth the program requirements and covered benefits of the Self-Empowered Life Funding (SELF) HCBS waiver program, as administered by DODD. This rule is being amended to reflect proposed changes to the SELF waiver application, for a target effective date of 1/1/2019. The amendment is a culmination of work undertaken by DODD with internal and external stakeholders to add and modify services to the SELF benefit package. Proposed new services include Assistive Technology; modified services include Remote Monitoring, Remote Monitoring Equipment, and the sub-component Assistive Technology Assessment, under the Career Planning Service. In addition to the modified benefit package, this rule also was revised to provide clarification, rule reference corrections, and language edits.

<u>Rule 5160-42-01</u>: entitled <u>Medicaid home and community-based services program-level one</u> <u>waiver</u>. This rule sets forth the program requirements and covered benefits of the Level One (L1) HCBS waiver program, as administered by DODD. This rule is being amended to reflect proposed changes to the L1 waiver application, for a target effective date of 1/1/2019. The amendment is a culmination of work undertaken by DODD with internal and external stakeholders to add and modify services to the L1 benefit package. Proposed new services include Assistive Technology; modified services include Remote Monitoring, Remote Monitoring Equipment, Personal Emergency Response System, and the sub-component Assistive Technology Assessment, under the Career Planning Service. In addition to the modified benefit package, this rule also was revised to provide clarification, rule reference corrections, and language edits.
