<u>Rule 5160-40-01</u>, entitled <u>Medicaid home and community-based services program-individual</u> <u>options waiver</u>. Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rule 5160-40-01 authorizes DODD to oversee the day-to-day operations of the Medicaid Individual Options (IO) waiver program for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. This rule currently sets forth definitions, enrollment criteria, benefit package components, individual service plan requirements, free choice of provider provisions, and due process rights.

As benefit package components are authorized by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) and are administratively overseen by the Department of Medicaid (ODM), outlining the components of the benefit package in the IO waiver OAC is duplicative and creates additional administrative processes to amend each time DODD and stakeholders revise the benefits offered under the waiver program. Therefore, this rule as amended proposes to remove current subparts of paragraph (F) and delineate that services may be found in the DODD OAC chapters as well as the federally approved waiver application.

Lastly, edits were made for consistency across ODM and DODD program rules regarding the IO waiver.

Rule 5160-41-17, entitled Medicaid home and community-based services program-self-empowered life funding waiver. OAC rule 5160-41-17 authorizes the DODD to oversee the day-to-day operations of the Medicaid Self-Empowerment Life Funding (SELF) waiver program for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. This rule currently sets forth definitions, enrollment criteria, benefit package components, individual service plan requirements, free choice of provider provisions, and due process rights.

As benefit package components are authorized by CMS and are administratively overseen by ODM, outlining the components of the benefit package in the SELF waiver OAC is duplicative and creates additional administrative processes to amend each time DODD and stakeholders revise the benefits offered under the waiver program. Therefore, this rule as amended proposes to remove current subparts of paragraph (F) and delineate that services may be found in the DODD OAC chapters as well as the federally approved waiver application.

Rule 5160-42-01, entitled Medicaid home and community-based services program-level one waiver. OAC rule 5160-42-01 authorizes DODD to oversee the day-to-day operations of the Medicaid Level One (L1) waiver program for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. This rule currently sets forth definitions, enrollment criteria, benefit package components, individual service plan requirements, free choice of provider provisions, and due process rights.

As benefit package components are authorized by the CMS and are administratively overseen by ODM, outlining the benefit limitations and components of the benefit package in the L1 waiver is duplicative and creates additional administrative processes to amend each time DODD and stakeholders revise the benefits offered under the waiver program. Therefore, this rule as amended proposes to remove current subparts of paragraphs (F) and (G) and delineate that services, and accompanying limits, may be found in the DODD OAC chapters as well as the federally approved waiver application.

Lastly, edits were made for consistency across ODM and DODD program rules regarding the L1 waiver.
