Pursuant to Chapter 119. and section 5164.02 of the Revised Code, the Director of the Ohio Department of Medicaid (ODM) gives notice of ODM's intent to consider the adoption, amendment, or rescission of the rule identified below and of a public hearing thereon.

Rule 5160-1-60, "Medicaid payment," sets forth payment policies for services furnished by many professional, non-institutional providers. This rule specifies the method used by the Ohio Department of Medicaid (ODM) to establish maximum payment amounts for newly adopted procedures. The appendix to this rule has been amended to incorporate new payment rates for the following services:

Transcranial magnetic stimulation for the treatment of refractory depression.

Group pregnancy education in accordance with the coverage of pregnancy-related services in rule 5160-21-04.

Lactation consulting services in accordance with coverage of lactation consulting services in new rule 5160-8-42.

Diabetes self-management training in accordance with new rule 5160-8-53, effective January 1, 2022.

In addition, ODM is amending the payment amounts for vaccine administration codes to reflect new 2022 CMS payment amounts for these vaccine administration codes. ODM is also amending payment rates for medication-assisted treatment (MAT) to align with Opioid Treatment Program payment rates.

These above-listed rate changes are expected to be effective January 1, 2022.

Additionally, with this rule amendment, ODM formally incorporated the payment rate revisions for EEG codes 95700-95716 that were adopted as of July 1, 2021.

ODM will hold the public hearing for this rule package via teleconference and in-person. All inperson attendees are required to follow ODM health and safety protocols, including temperature checks, wearing a face mask, and practicing social distancing when inside the

ODM office. The date and time for the public hearing are listed at the top of this Notice as well as the phone number, PIN (access code), and link for teleconference attendance, and location for

All interested parties are invited to participate in the public hearing. Both oral and written testimony will be accepted for this hearing and will be given the same consideration. Persons who want to give oral testimony are asked to send a message by e-mail to <u>Rules@medicaid.ohio.gov</u> no later than one hour before the hearing to be added to the witness list. There will be a final call at the end of the hearing for persons who wish to offer oral testimony but do not yet appear on the witness list.

Written comments submitted by e-mail, postal mail, or fax that are received or postmarked no later than the day of the hearing will be accepted as testimony and will become part of the hearing record. All testimony will become public record; therefore, ODM asks that protected health information (PHI) be excluded unless the information belongs to the person submitting the testimony or to a person for which the submitter is a legal guardian. Written testimony sent by e-mail is highly recommended. All persons who submit testimony by e-mail will be sent a confirmation of receipt.
