Pursuant to Chapter 119. and section 5164.02 of the Ohio Revised Code, the director of the Ohio Department of Medicaid (ODM) gives notice of ODM's intent to consider the amendment of the rule identified below and to hold a public hearing on this rule.

Rule 5160-4-12, "Immunizations, injections and infusions (including trigger-point injections), and provider-administered pharmaceuticals," sets forth general coverage and payment policies for injections and pharmaceuticals administered by medical practitioners. This rule is being amended. Several changes are being made:

- Terms identified in Am. Sub. H. B. 166 (133rd G. A.) as causing a rule to be deemed to contain regulatory restrictions have been replaced.
- Definitions of terms not used in the rule are removed.
- Certain other terms and phrases are updated or clarified.
- A shortened form is given for the web address of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
- Statements that payment is the lesser of the provider's submitted charge or the established Medicaid maximum amount are removed because they are unnecessary. This specification is set forth in paragraph (B) of rule 5160-1-60 of the Ohio Administrative Code, "Medicaid payment."

There is no substantive change in policy.

ODM will hold the public hearing for this rule package via teleconference and in person. All in-person attendees are required to follow ODM health and safety protocols, including undergoing a temperature check when entering the building and wearing a face mask and practicing social distancing while inside.

The date and time for the public hearing are listed at the top of this Notice, as well as the teleconference phone number, PIN (access code), online meeting link, and physical location. All interested parties are invited to participate in the public hearing. Both oral and written testimony will be accepted for this hearing and will be given the same consideration. Persons who want to give oral testimony are asked to send a message by e-mail to rules@medicaid.ohio.gov no later than one hour before the hearing to be added to the witness list. There will be a final call at the end of the hearing for persons who wish to offer oral testimony but do not yet appear on the witness list.

Written comments submitted by e-mail, postal mail, or fax that are received or postmarked no later than the day of the hearing will be accepted as testimony and will become part of the hearing record. All testimony will become public record; therefore, ODM asks that protected health information (PHI) be excluded unless the information belongs to the person submitting the testimony or to a person for which the submitter is a legal guardian. Written testimony sent by e-mail is highly recommended. All persons who submit testimony by e-mail will be sent a confirmation of receipt.
