Thank you for your review of the business impact analysis for the draft rules pertaining to online driver education under Chapter 4501-7 of the OAC. The Ohio Department of Public Safety (ODPS), Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS), has received and read your review, recommendations, and conclusions. The rules will be revised as recommended to define the terms “driver education” and “driver training.” On Monday, March 25, 2013, OCJS intends to formally file these rules and all required materials with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review and the Legislative Service Commission.
