Thank you for your review of the business impact analysis for the drafted rules pertaining to Remedial Driving Courses under Chapter 4501-21, which included rules 4501-21-01, 4501-21-02, 4501-21-04, 4501-21-05, 4501-21-06, 4501-21-08, 4501-21-12, 4501-21-13, and 4501-21-15 of the OAC. The Ohio Department of Public Safety (ODPS), Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS), has received and read your review, recommendations, and conclusions.

OCJS has modified the Business Impact Analysis to include the time it may take a business to receive an initial and renewal approval to operate.

On January 6, 2014 OCJS intends to formally file these rules and all required materials with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review and the Legislative Service Commission. OCJS plans to conduct a hearing pursuant to R.C. 119.03 on February 7, 2014 at 10am in the Ohio Department of Public Safety Motorcycle Ohio Room 134, 1970 West Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio, 43223. OCJS anticipates final-filing the rule with an effective date of March 14, 2014.
