Thank you for your review of the business impact analysis for Chapter 4765-11 of the Administrative Code. The Ohio Department of Public Safety (ODPS), Division of Emergency Medical Services (EMS), has received and read your review, recommendations, and conclusions. We are aware that, due to the creation of an electronic form, draft rule 4765-11-01 of the Administrative Code did not include the form numbers of two incorporated references. The rule will include all required materials when filed with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review and the Legislative Service Commission.

By mid-January 2014, the Division of EMS intends to formally file Chapter 4765-11 of the Administrative Code and all required materials with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review and the Legislative Service Commission. The Division of EMS plans to conduct a public hearing pursuant to R.C. 119.03 in February 2014 at the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Room C4-8, 1970 West Broad Street, Columbus Ohio, 43223. The Division of EMS anticipates final-filing the rules with an effective date of April 30, 2014.
