Thank you for your review of the business impact analysis for Chapter 4566-2 of the Administrative Code (Medical Transportation Organization). The Ohio Department of Public Safety (ODPS), Division of Emergency Medical Services (EMS), has received and read your review, recommendations, and conclusions.

The Common Sense Initiative Office recommendation letter of June 10, 2014, inadvertently identified the chapter as Chapter 4766-5 instead of Chapter 4766-2. The remainder of the letter's content is correct. However, I am making mention of the fact in writing as directed by the Common Sense Initiative Office on June 13, 2014.

On July 11, 2014, the Division of EMS intends to formally file rules 4566-2-11, 4766-2-14 and 4766-2-17 of the Administrative Code and all the required materials with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review and the Legislative Service Commission. The Division of EMS plans to conduct a public hearing pursuant to R.C. 119.03 on August 20, 2014 at the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Room 134, 1970 West Broad Street, Columbus Ohio, 43223. The Division of EMS anticipates final-filing the rule with an effective date of September 25, 2014.
