Thank you for your review of the business impact analysis for Chapter 4501-21 of the Ohio Administrative Code (O.A.C.) pertaining to remedial driving schools. The Ohio Department of Public Safety, Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS) Driver Training Program, has received and read your review, recommendations, and conclusions.

On April 9, 2015, OCJS, Driver Training Program intends to formally file O.A.C. 4501-21, and all required materials, with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review.
