Thank you for your review of the business impact analysis for Chapter 4501-7 of the Ohio Administrative Code (O.A.C.) pertaining to Commercial Driver Training Schools. The Ohio Department of Public Safety, Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS) Driver Training Program, has received and read your review, recommendations, and conclusions.

On December 15, 2015, OCJS, Driver Training Program intends to formally file O.A.C. 4501-7, and all required materials, with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review. OCJS Driver Training Program anticipates conducting a public hearing pursuant to R.C. 119.03 on January 18, 2015 at the Ohio Department of Public Safety.
