Thank you for your review of the business impact analysis for Chapter 4766-3 (*Ambulettes*) of the Administrative Code. The Ohio Department of Public Safety (ODPS), Division of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) has received and read your reviews, recommendations, and conclusions.

By mid-March 2017, the Division of EMS intends to formally file OAC Chapter 4766-3 and all required materials with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review, the Ohio Legislative Service Commission, and the Secretary of State.

The Division of EMS plans to conduct a public hearing pursuant to Revised Code 119.03 in April 2017. The Division of EMS anticipates final-filing the rules with an approximate effective date in June 2017.
