Re: CSI Review of Amended Rules

The Common Sense Initiative (CSI) Division of the Office of the Lieutenant Governor had no recommendations regarding the following proposed amended rules:

Rule 4741-1-02 OAC provides requirements for a Specialist. The amended version eliminates the need to issue a certificate of registration.

Rule 4741-1-03 OAC sets out the requirements for minimum standards for stationary veterinary facilities. The Board has modified the rule to eliminate the requirement that licenses and renewal certificates must be displayed.

Rule 4741-1-08 OAC specifies the requirements for the operation of a mobile veterinary practice. The Board has modified the rule to eliminate the requirement that licenses and renewal certificates must be displayed.

Rule 4741-1-11 OAC provides the requirements for continuing education required for renewal as a veterinarian or a registered veterinary technician. The proposed revision will permit the renewal application to be emailed to the licensee.

Rule 4741-1-23 OAC defines requirements for Livestock management practices. Recent rule changes by the Ohio Department of Agriculture required the need to update the Board's rule to eliminate tail docking for dairy cattle under the duties of an owner's agent.

Rule 4741-1-20 OAC describes the general provisions for a livestock ambulatory unit. The Board has modified the rule to eliminate the requirement that license and renewal certificates must be displayed.

Therefore, the Ohio Veterinary Medical Licensing Board will file the rules as proposed with JCARR Tuesday, February 6, 2018 to meet the timeline for a rules hearing at the March 14, 2018 board meeting.
