Thank you for your review of the business impact analysis for Chapter 4765-7 (*Accreditation of Training Programs*) of the Administrative Code. The Ohio Department of Public Safety (ODPS), Division of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) has received and read your reviews, recommendations, and conclusions.

In early March 2018, the Division of EMS intends to formally file OAC Chapter 4765-7 and all required materials with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review, the Ohio Legislative Service Commission, and the Secretary of State.

The Division of EMS plans to conduct a public hearing pursuant to Revised Code 119.03 in April 2018. The Division of EMS anticipates final-filing the rules with an approximate effective date in June 2018.
