#### 2. Why is the regulation being rescinded?

These rules are being rescinded due to Am. Sub. H.B. 49 (132<sup>nd</sup> GA), which abolished the Ohio Board of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology and Ohio Hearing Aid Dealers and Fitters Licensing Board and created the Ohio Speech and Hearing Professionals Board, effective January 21, 2018. These rules addressed procedural and administrative functions of the former boards. The administrative and procedure functions are now covered under the Ohio Speech and Hearing Professionals Board, pursuant to Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 4744.

### 3. Please describe in general terms the adverse impacts to business, including currently impacted industries, in the existing rule(s).

All of these rules addressed procedural and administrative requirements by the former boards such as public meeting notices, sunshine law, duties of board officers, etc. The Board maintains that these rules caused no adverse impact to business. The following professions are licensed by the Board; audiology, hearing aid dealing and fitting, and speech-language pathology.

4. Are there other regulations (either existing or to be created) which will replace the regulation being rescinded or which will now apply because this regulation is being rescinded? This can include rules, statute, federal regulations, agency policies, or industry standards etc.

Yes, all of the rescinded rules are being proposed as new rules under the Ohio Speech and Hearing Professionals Board under Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 4744. A Business Impact Analysis will be submitted for all of the new proposed rules replacing these rescinded rules.
