RE: PUCO Response – Coal Emergency (Ohio Adm.Code Chapter 4901:5-23)

In Case No. 22-59-AU-ORD, the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO) reviewed Ohio Adm.Code Chapter 4901:5-23 to comply with R.C. 111.15(B) and R.C. 106.03(A), which require state agencies to conduct a review of their rules every five years and R.C. 121.951(A)(1), which requires state agencies to reduce their total number of regulatory restrictions. The rules in Ohio Adm.Code Chapter 4901:5-23 outline the standards for coal suppliers under an energy emergency and the process by which suppliers must contact its consumers and alert them of an impending shortage of coal.

By Entry issued October 5, 2022, the PUCO established a formal comment period to receive stakeholder feedback regarding the PUCO's proposed amendments to the rules; however, no comments were received. Thereafter, the PUCO issued a Finding and Order on February 22, 2023, adopting the proposed changes to the rules as attached to the order. On March 8, 2023, the Common Sense Initiative (CSI) Office replied to the PUCO, stating that CSI had no recommendations, and concluding that the PUCO should proceed with formal filing of the rules package with the Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review (JCARR). In, light of CSI's conclusion, the PUCO will proceed and file the rules with JCARR.
