It is the Ohio Attorney General's intent that this rule provide a framework for implementation of the continuing professional training program as enacted by SB 281 of the 126th General Assembly.

This rule outlines the procedure for the reimbursement of training costs for public appointing authorities. The rule lists the standards that are needed in order to qualify for reimbursement and also states that failure to report compliance with the continuing professional training requirements will result in a forfeiture of the appointed authority's eligibility for reimbursement. The rule also states that each public appointing authority that receives funds under the continuing professional training program shall keep those funds separate from any other funds and shall use those funds only for applying the cost of continuing professional training programs.

The Attorney General expects the continuing professional training program to increase expenditures by roughly \$2.5 million. This increase is attributable to a combination of start up expenses and training reimbursement from the GRF.

The cost of compliance with the continuing professional training requirements will vary by appointing authority. There are 984 agencies in the State that appoint peace officers and Ohio State Highway Patrol Troopers and while the training requirement is the same for each, the cost of compliance will necessarily be differenct for each. However, the Attorney General will reimburse each public appointing authority \$20.00 per officer, per hour to off-set the cost of training.

The cost of compliance with the continuing professional training requirements will vary by appointing authority. There are 984 agencies in the State that appoint peace officers and State Highway Patrol Troopers. While the training requirement is the same for each, the cost of compliance will necessarily be different for each. However, and as delineated in the proposed rules, the Attorney General's Office will reimburse each public appointing authority \$20.00 per officer, per hour to off-set the cost of the training.

The Attorney General's Office anticipates that it will incur approximately \$250,000 in start-up costs, the bulk of which is attributable to the development of an on-line

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computer application by which agencies will track and report compliance. As to personal costs, it is the Attorney General's belief that the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy can absorb the additional work load without the need to increase staffing levels. As to actual costs of reimbursement, this will vary by year, depending on the number of hours of training mandated by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission. The Attorney General's Office expects the continuing professional training program to increase expenditures by roughly \$2.5 million in fiscal year 2008.

Per SB 281/R.C. 109.802, the Attorney General has endowed the Law Enforcement Assistance Fund with \$5 million to fund the GRF portion of the continuing professional training program for calendar years 2007 and 2008. Additionally, the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission has secured a \$3 million grant from the State Victims Assistance Act Board to fund the balance of reimbursements for calendar year 2007. As to the individual appointing agencies, the Attorney General will reimburse each public appointing authority \$20.00 per officer, per hour to

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off-set the cost of the training.
