The rule restricts the use of sick leave, vacation leave, and personal leave to when the accrual appears on an employee's earnings statement. The rule also contains the procedures, protocals, and limitations for the use of sick leave by a State employee. The proposed amendment will allow for sick leave hours 40.1 to 80 to be paid at 100% if the leave is associated with outpatient surgery of the State employee, the State employee's spouse, or a child residing with the State employee. The proposed amendment also allows sick leave hours 40.1 to 80 to be supplemented with additional sick leave to allow for the time off to be paid at 100% for medical appointments pre-scheduled at least 30 days in advance, provided that a doctor's statement is provided by the State employee on the first day that the State employee returns to work.
