This rule requires a boiler operator or steam engineer licensee applicant to meet certain experience requirements to qualify for the examination for the license. The requirement for a boiler operator or steam engineer license is imposed under section 4104.05 of the Revised Code. Nothing in the proposed rule changes increase or create a new requirement to engage in or operate a line of business.
