This rule regulates activities on areas owned, administered or under control of the Division of Wildlife as public fishing areas.

It is recommended that this rule be amended by updating the list of areas owned by American Electric Power that require a special permit to fish under an agreement with the Division of Wildlife. These areas are the ReCreation Lands, Conesville, Gavin, and Poston properties. The reference to the Kaul public hunting area will be removed, the agreement has expired. The reference to the Avondale area will be removed from the rule, the agreement has been canceled. The reference to the Ohio Power Recreation Area will also be deleted and replaced with ReCreation Lands.

It is further proposed to amend this rule regarding the possession of fish with a size limit taken from Pymatuning Lake. The proposed rule will require that fish be in the round (whole) when possessed while fishing or on the water. Fish may be filleted into a complete fillet or remain in the round when being transported to a permanent residence or being prepared for immediate consumption. The existing regulation requires that fish remain in the round only. This change will provide consistency with rule 1501:31-13-08(I).
