This rule establishes the fishing regulations for the eastern and western fishing units of the Ohio River.

7. Summarize the rule's content, and if this is an amended rule, also summarize the rule's changes.

It is proposed to amend this rule by reducing the combined daily bag limit of sauger, saugeye or walleye from ten to six in the eastern and western fishing units of the

Ohio River. Additionally, it is proposed to establish a fourteen inch minimum length limit on sauger, saugeye and walleye in the western fishing unit of the Ohio River. The Division of Wildlife manages Ohio River fisheries cooperatively with other states that border the Ohio River. The Kentucky Department of Wildlife Resources has recently reduced the combined daily bag limit from ten fish to six fish and have implemented a fourteen inch minimum length limit. The proposed change will align Ohio regulations with Kentucky regulations in the western fishing unit of the Ohio River. West Virginia is proposing a reduced combined daily bag limit from ten fish to six fish, with no minimum length limit. The proposed change will provide a consistent set of regulations in the eastern fishing unit of the Ohio River.
