2. Update cross-references.

3. Reduce the use of unnecessary regulatory restrictions (e.g., "shall") in this rule to comply with R.C. §§ 106.03 and 121.951. This accounts for many non-substantive amendments that comprise a majority of ODA's proposed amendments to this rule.

3. Replace uses of "pre-certification review" with "review" because the provider is certified before applying.

4. Delete all words after the word "application" in paragraphs (D) and (E) of this rule because those words are unnecessary.
