1. Replace occurrences of "Chapter 173-4 of the Administrative Code" with "this chapter" to comply with the Legislative Service Commission's Rule Drafting Manual.

2. Define "Dietary Guidelines for Americans."

3. Replace the reference to "Title III, part C of the Older Americans Act of 1965, 79 Stat. 219, 42 U.S.C. 3001, as amended by the Older Americans Reauthorization Act of 2016" with "42 U.S.C. 3030d-21 to 3030g-23 (2020)."
