The rule is being amended due to recent changes in statute regarding the credentialing of teachers at STEM schools (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) established under Chapter 3326. of the Revised Code.

The rule establishes the parameters for twelve hour or forty hour temporary teaching permit for

qualified nonlicensed individuals. Amendments include the addition of language enabling the issuance of a forty hour teaching permit to a qualified nonlicensed individual engaged to teach in a STEM school.

The cost of compliance would consist of costs associated with a nonlicensed individual applying for a forty hour teaching permit if they are engaged as a teacher by a STEM school and need one of these permits in order to teach. The cost for the permit itself would be \$40.00 for a one year permit and the applicant would also pay the cost of BCII and FBI criminal background checks that are required for any teaching license or permit. BCII charges \$22.00 for the BCI check and \$24.00 for the FBI check although other background check service providers (private companies, ESC??s, etc.) may charge more for these services.
