This rule is being refiled to offer clarification on the extension of the world languages alternative educator license to individuals who wish to teach in grades pre-kindergarten to three. Section 3319.26 of the Revised Code mandates the establishment of an alternative educator license for grades four through twelve in a "designated subject area," which includes world languages. However, the statute does not limit that license to grades four to twelve.

Section 3319.22 of the Revised Code authorizes the State Board of Education to promulgate any license that it elects, and to adopt rules that set the criteria for such licenses. In crafting Rule 3301-24-20, the State Board adopted all of the criteria mandated by Section 3319.26 of the Revised Code. The State Board then exercised its authority under Section 3319.22 of the Revised Code and extended those

requirements to individuals who wish to teach world languages in grades Pre-K-3.

There may be an initial increase in revenues as the new alternative resident educator license, the four year term of which was prescribed by HB 1, will cost \$160.00. (In the past, educators typically paid \$80.00 for a two-year term.) However, as educators would pay \$40.00 per year regardless of the length of licensure term, the increase in revenues for the department would even out in the long term.

The fee for the license is \$160.00 for a four year term. Applicants would also need to meet the criminal background check requirements associated with all licenses, although this is not a new requirement. The cost of a criminal background check varies both by location and agency providing the service.
