## 3701-84-34.2 Termination of an adult cardiac catheterization service.

- (A) The director may terminate the operation of an adult cardiac catheterization service, or service, for the following:
  - (1) The director determines, based on clinical criteria including, but not limited to, major complications, the frequency of emergency transfers, and death, that the service poses an imminent threat of serious physical or life-threatening danger to the recipients of cardiac catheterization services;
  - (2) Failure of the service to meet designated quality outcome benchmarks, as evidenced by annual reports of the service's national cardiovascular registry/CathPCI registry reports or the service's annual reportable interventions; or
  - (3) Failure of the service to comply with the provisions of this chapter.
- (B) The director shall provide written notice of termination to the service via certified mail.
- (C) A notice of termination may appealed in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code. A notice of appeal must be filed with the director not later than thirty days after the notice's date of mailing. If requested by the service, the director shall provide a hearing in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Revised Code.
