The cost associated with this rule for the facility would be the staff time associated with the proper labeling of the working containers of toxic materials and the cost, time to ordering materials to label the containers, and the working containers. Cost will vary depending on the number of working containers of toxic materials, such as a sanitizer bottle, that would need labeled. Cost of a working container ranges from \$1.75 and up one container.
