This regulation was voted on at a monthly meeting. The rule relaxes the standards required for providing medical care at the race tracks.

The rule changes the "temporary hospital," which permit holders were required to provide, into "first aid rooms." Rather than staffing the first aid room with a doctor and a nurse, the room must now be staffed with paramedics or EMTs.

This will increase revenues.

Under OAC 3769-14-99, any violation of this rule could result in a fine. Fines bring in revenue for the Racing Commission. However, this amount is not determinable because the revenue depends on how many permit holders violate the rule and the severity of the violation. The amendment does not increase the potential revenue.

Provide a summary of the estimated cost of compliance with the rule to all directly affected persons. When appropriate, please include the source for your information/estimated costs, e.g. industry, CFR, internal/agency:

Internal agency experts determined that the cost of compliance includes supplies and staffing for the first aid room. The cost of supplying a physician or paramedic and a nurse under the original rule was over \$500 per race day. The amendment will likely cost hundreds of dollars less. The cost of supplies for the first aid room is around \$200. Defibrillators are provided by the Commission. In the event a permit holder violates the rule, the permit holder could be subjected to fines.
