4755-7-01 **Supervision.** 

Supervision must ensure consumer protection.

- (A) The following provisions apply to supervision of limited permit holders and occupational therapy assistants:
  - (1) A supervising occupational therapist shall adhere to the following criteria:
    - (a) Be licensed, and in good standing, by the occupational therapy section of the Ohio occupational therapy, physical therapy and athletic trainers board; and
    - (b) When maintaining a separate caseload, a 1.0 full-time equivalent (FTE) occupational therapist will supervise no more than four FTE limited permit holders and/or occupational therapy assistants; and
    - (c) When performing client evaluations and supervision only, with no client treatment responsibilities, a 1.0 FTE occupational therapist will supervise no more than six FTE limited permit holders and/or occupational therapy assistants; and
    - (d) A supervising occupational therapist with the status of less than 1.0 FTE shall supervise a proportionate number of occupational therapy assistants and limited permit holders.
  - (2) The supervising occupational therapist shall confirm that the limited permit holder and/or occupational therapy assistant hold current permits or licenses to practice occupational therapy as provided in section 4755.074755.08 of the Revised Code, prior to allowing the limited permit holder and/or occupational therapy assistant to engage in the practice of occupational therapy.
  - (3) Any documentation written by an occupational therapy assistant or a limited permit holder for inclusion in the client's official record shall be co-signed by the supervising occupational therapist.
- (B) Supervision of the limited permit holder, as defined in section 4755.074755.08 of the Revised Code, does not require the supervising occupational therapist to be on-site, but the supervisor must be available for consultation with the limited permit holder at all times. The supervisor and the limited permit holder must meet in person a minimum of once per week.
  - (1) The occupational therapist limited permit holder and the occupational therapy

- assistant limited permit holder must be supervised by a licensed occupational therapist.
- (2) Supervision requires an interactive process between the supervising occupational therapist and the limited permit holder. The interactive process must include, but is not limited to, review of the following: client assessment, reassessment, treatment plan, intervention and the discontinuation of intervention, and/or treatment plan. Co-signing client documentation alone does not meet the minimum level of supervision.
- (3) The supervising occupational therapist shall consult with the limited permit holder before the limited permit holder's initiation of any client's treatment plan and/or modification of the treatment plan.
- (4) It is the responsibility of the occupational therapy practitioner to establish evidence that the supervision as set forth in rule 4755-7-01 of the Administrative Code has occurred according to the established guidelines. This evidence may be included in the client records or exist as a separate document, such as a supervision log.
- (C) Supervision of the occupational therapy assistant as defined in <u>division (C) of</u> section 4755.01(C)4755.04 of the Revised Code, requires initial direction and periodic inspection of the service delivery and relevant in-service training. The supervising occupational therapist need not be on-site, but must be available for consultation with the occupational therapy assistant at all times.
  - (1) The supervising occupational therapist must provide supervision, a minimum of once per week, to all occupational therapy assistants who are in their first year of practice.
  - (2) The supervising occupational therapist must provide supervision, a minimum of once per month, to all occupational therapy assistants beyond their first year of practice.
  - (3) Supervision requires an interactive process between the supervising occupational therapist and the occupational therapy assistant. The interactive process must include, but is no limited to, review of the following: client assessment, reassessment, treatment plan, intervention and the discontinuation of intervention, and/or treatment plan. Co-signing client documentation alone does not meet the minimum level of supervision.
  - (4) It is the responsibility of the occupational therapy practitioner to establish

evidence that the supervision as set forth in rule 4755-7-01 of the Administrative Code has occurred according to the established guidelines. This evidence may be included in the client records or exist as a separate document, such as a supervision log.

- (D) The following provisions apply to supervision of level II occupational therapy students:
  - (1) A supervising occupational therapy practitioner shall adhere to the following criteria:
    - (a) Be licensed, and in good standing, by the occupational therapy section of the Ohio occupational therapy, physical therapy and athletic trainers board; and
    - (b) Must have completed one year of clinical practice experience as a fully licensed occupational therapy practitioner.
  - (2) The supervising occupational therapy practitioner shall only assign duties or functions to the occupational therapy student that are commensurate with his/her education and training.
  - (3) An occupational therapy student shall be supervised by an occupational therapist. An occupational therapy assistant student shall be supervised by a licensed occupational therapist or a licensed occupational therapy assistant.
