Estimated costs are: obtaining a qualifying degree, which costs from \$30,000 to \$90,000 depending on the school attended; application costs \$60; exam for licensure is \$230; the board's laws and rules exam is \$10; criminal records checks are \$50 to \$99 depending on the vendor selected; transcripts cost from \$5 to \$15 depending on the college.

A denial of licensure could have costs for an attorney if one were hired with cost of \$1,000 to \$2,000 most denials result in an applicant representing themselves at a cost of mileage and time to appear.
