The Ohio Chemical Dependency Professionals (OCDP) Board is eliminating the Case Presentation Method (CPM) exam as a requirement for obtaining the independent chemical dependency counselor license (LICDC). This action is the result of the International Certification and Reciprocity Consortium (IC&RC) decision to stop requiring and supporting the CPM exam and integrate its components into a new Alcohol and Other Drug Addiction (AODA) written exam. The OCDP Board is a member of the IC&RC and supports this decision. Moreover, the Board's licensing requirements are base on the IC&RC credentialing requirements. As a result, it is important for the Board to stay aligned with the

IC&RC.

The new AODA written exam containing the CPM exam components is scheduled for use starting June 13, 2008. Rolling the CPM exam components into this new written exam will reduce by one the number of exams a person must take to obtain licensure from the OCDP Board, making the OCDP Board license more accessible and potentially more attainable while maintaining a high quality chemical dependency treatment workforce.

SB 189 (125 G.A.) made a minor language change to the related statute 4758.40 with regards to the level of degree required to obtain the LICDC credential. SB 189 added language that a person must hold "at least" a masters degree in a behavioral science clearly permiting an individual with a higher degree to qualify for the LICDC credential. The Board intends to adjust the rule language regarding the degree level to harmonize it with current statute.

This rule establishes the requirements for obtaining the Ohio Chemical Dependency Professionals (OCDP) Board independent chemical dependency counselor license (LICDC). The proposed change to the rule will eliminate the provision requiring successful completion of the ICRC/AODA CPM oral examination (Case Presentation Method exam) as a criterion for obtaining the LICDC credential.

In order to harmonize this rule with current OCDP Board statute, the phrase "At least a" will be inserted at the beginning of line (A)(1) of this rule describing the level and type of degree a person must have to obtain the LICDC credential.

Any loss of revenue due to the CPM Exam elimination will be off set, in part, by the elimination of costs associated with conducting the exam.

Lost revenue will be further off set by an expected increase in the number of

individuals seeking an OCDP Board license. Rolling the CPM Exam components into the new written exam scheduled for use starting June 13, 2008 will reduce by one the number of exams a person must take to obtain licensure from the OCDP Board, making the Board license more accessible and potentially more achievable while maintaining a high quality chemical dependency treatment workforce.

No fiscal impact is expected with harmonizing the rule with a minor language change made in SB 189 (125th G.A.) related to the type of behavorial science degree that is required to obtain the LICDC credential.
