This rule is being proposed as a new rule in accordance with 4765.55 of the Revised Code.

This rule sets forth the process for a fire instructor, assistant fire instructor or fire safety inspector instructor to request an exemption from continuing education or instructional requirements due to military duty, medical hardship or unusual hardship.

The estimated cost for stakeholders was determined to be zero by the Firefighter and Fire Safety Inspector Training Committee and replies to a statewide survey sent to all chartered programs to ascertain adverse impact. The committee members include fire chiefs, firefighters, fire instructors, fire safety inspector instructors, fire safety inspectors, and training program directors.

A.) Does this rule require a license, permit, or any other prior authorization to engage in or operate a line of business? No

This rule, in and of itself, does not require prior authorization to engage in business. However, it is part of a filing package that does, as rule 4765-20-01 and some provisions in Chapter 4765-21 require persons to apply for and renew the appropriate instructor certificate issued by the EMS executive director prior to engaging in fire service instruction.

B.) Does this rule impose a criminal penalty, a civil penalty, or another sanction, or create a cause of action, for failure to comply with its terms? Yes

Failure to comply with the terms set forth in this rule may result in an exemption for continuing education to be denied. Further, some provisions in Chapter 4765-23 establish that an administrative sanction, up to and including the revocation of an instructor certificate, may be imposed for violations of Chapter 4765.55 of the Revised Code and Chapters 4765-11, 4765-20 to 4765-23 of the Administrative Code pursuant to rule 4765-23-02 of the Administrative Code.

C.) Does this rule require specific expenditures or the report of information as a condition of compliance? Yes

This rule requires an applicant seeking exemption from continuing education requirements due to military duty, medical hardship or unusual hardship to submit either proof of active military duty during the certification period for which the exemption is requested or justification for exemption due to due to medical hardship or unusual hardship.
