This rule is being proposed to implement provisions of House Bill 98 and House Bill 488, 130th General Assembly, pertaining to military applications for

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certification.

The proposed rule sets forth the process for identifying, prioritizing, and expediting initial applications and applications for certificate renewals submitted by veterans and spouses of veterans for firefighter, fire safety inspector, fire instructor, fire safety inspector instructor, and assistant fire instructor pursuant to Chapter 4765-20 and/or Chapter 4765-21 of the Administrative Code. The proposed rule describes how relevant military experience, education, and training are considered for eligibility for fire service certificates. The proposed rule provides for the renewal of expired certificates when the expiration is related to military service and states that no penalties shall be assessed for submitting a late renewal application in such cases. The proposed rule provides for an extension of time to complete continuing education and instructional renewal requirements for a certificate holder who is serving on active duty and for a certificate holder who is absent from this state due to being the spouse of a person serving on active duty.
