rule does not limit eligibility to serve as a medical director to only those physicians who have completed a residency or fellowship program in emergency medicine or a related area or who are certified or eligible to be certified in a specialty or subspecialty of emergency medicine or a related area, as set forth in section 4765.42 of the RC.

Paragraph (A)(2) has been reworded to include the phrase "three of the previous five years" and to include the phrase "or has provided medical oversight for an EMS agency."

Sections of the deleted paragraphs (A)(5)(a) though (A)(5)(e) have been included in the new paragraph (A)(3).
