EMT instructor curriculum.

- (A) An EMS instructor training program shall consist of eighty hours allocated among the following areas:
- (1) Thirty-four hours in the review and update of curriculum knowledge and skill objectives;
 - (2) Except as provided in (B) of this rule, thirty-six hours in instruction of adult students and basic teaching techniques;
 - (3) Ten hours of supervised teaching in the presence of a person who holds a current certificate to teach at the appropriate EMS instructor training level.
- (B) An EMT-paramedic instructor training program shall consist of a minimum of eighty hours allocated among the following areas:
- (1) Thirty-four hours in the review and update of EMT-paramedic curriculum knowledge and skill objectives;
 - (2) Except as provided in paragraph (D) of this rule, thirty-six hours in instruction of adult students and basic teaching techniques;
 - (3) Except as provided in paragraph (D) of this rule, ten hours of supervised teaching in the presence of a person who holds a current certificate to teach at the EMT-paramedic level.
- (C) A person seeking certification under section 4765.23 of the Revised Code as an EMT instructor who holds at least a baccalaureate degree in adult education from an accredited institution deemed acceptable by the division, as directed by the board, need only complete that portion of an EMS instructor program set forth in paragraphs (A)(1) and (A)(3) of this rule.
- (C) An EMS instructor may teach at any level up to and including the level of their EMS certificate to practice.
