5101:2-16-02 "Application and qualification process for receipt of publicly funded child care benefits" outlines the application and eligibility process for publicly funded child care benefits. The initial income eligibility requirements are being updated to one hundred forty-five percent of the federal poverty level and the definition of a minor parent caretaker family is being clarified.
