This rule is being proposed for amendment to incorporate Medicaid maximum fee increases budgeted in Am. Sub. H.B. 119, 127th General Assembly, because the dollars appropriated to JFS in the 600-525 account, found in section 309.10 of H.B. 119, assume the expenditures with these changes.

then summarize the content of the rule:

This rule sets forth the increase in the reimbursement rates for home health services effective January 1, 2008. Changes include the following: Nursing provided by either a registered nurse or licensed practical nurse shall be reimbursed \$56.65 for the first hour and \$5.87 for each fifteen minute unit thereafter; home health aide services shall be reimbursed \$24.72 for the first hour and \$3.09 for each fifteen minute unit thereafter; physical therapy, occupational therapy, and speech language pathology shall be reimbursed \$72.10 for the first hour and \$4.64 for each fifteen minutes unit thereafter. Also, changes include coverage and reimbursement provisions for home health services delivered in a facility/home or an assisted living facility.
