This rule is being amended to attain cost savings prescribed in RC Section 5111.0213, adopted under Amended Substitute House Bill 153 of the 129th General

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Assembly. It is also being amended because of implementation of the Medicaid Information Technology System (MITS).

This rule contains the reimbursement rates and billing procedures associated with home care attendant services provided by the Ohio Home Care Waiver. Changes to the rule decrease the Medicaid maximum rate of reimbursement for ODJFS-administered home care attendant services available through the Ohio Home Care Waiver effective beginning with date of service October 1, 2011. The base rate for non-agency providers of home care attendant services will be reduced from \$33.36 to \$25.89.

Paragraph (I) is changed to say that claims shall be submitted to, and reimbursement shall be provided by, ODJFS in accordance with Chapter 5101:3-1 of the Administrative Code.

Home care attendant services is a relatively new service that is just now beginning to be used. Before the rate reduction imposed by this rule change, the fiscal impact of introducing home care attendant services was expected to be neutral. This was because ODJFS anticipated offsetting upward and downward pressure on spending to result from the advent of this service. Downward pressure on spending was expected to result from home care attendant services being used in place of some nursing services; upward pressure on spending was expected to result from a higher base rate to be paid to home care attendant-qualified aides for initial service time as compared to the base rate they would earn for regular personal care aide services.

The rate reduction associated with this rule change is occurring in concert with rate reductions for nursing and personal care aide services. As a result, ODJFS still expects offsetting spending pressures to result as the utilization of home care attendant services grows over the course of the biennium. The reduced rate for home care attendant services will still be a cost-saver when paid in place of the reduced rate for nursing; and the cost to ODJFS of paying the reduced base rate for

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home care attendant services in place of the reduced base rate for regular personal care aide will still be a bit more.

15. Provide a summary of the estimated cost of compliance with the rule to all directly affected persons. When appropriate, please include the source for your information/estimated costs, e.g. industry, CFR, internal/agency:

The Department does not believe the changes to this rule place new compliance obligations on directly affected persons; therefore, there would not be that type of compliance costs. However, the changes in this rule will reduce Medicaid reimbursement to providers. To the extent that a reduction in reimbursement results in a decrease in Medicaid revenue to the affected persons, the decrease in revenue will affect cash flow and may create an impact that results in the affected persons incurring other types of costs. The Department cannot provide an estimate of what this cost impact would be for the affected persons because that information is not available to the Department and the impact will be provider-specific and depend upon multiple factors, including individual business models, amount of Medicaid services provided, and overhead costs, etc. In addition, the Department recognizes that some providers may choose to discontinue providing these services because of the rate reduction. And certain beneficiaries will need to work with new providers.
