This rule is being proposed for amendment to incorporate Medicaid maximum fee increases budgeted in Am. Sub. H.B. 119, 127th General Assembly, because the dollars appropriated to JFS in the 600-525 account, found in section 309.10 of H.B. 119, assume the expenditures with these changes.

This rule sets forth the increase in the reimbursement rates for Ohio Home Care Waiver services effective January 1, 2008. Changes include the following: Waiver nursing provided by either a registered nurse or licensed practical nurse shall be reimbursed \$56.65 for the first hour and \$5.87 for each fifteen minute unit thereafter; personal care aide services shall be reimbursed \$24.72 for the first hour and \$3.09 for each fifteen minute unit thereafter; out of home respite shall be reimbursed \$206.00 per day; supplemental transportation services shall be reimbursed \$.39 per mile; adult day health center services shall be reimbursed \$33.48 per half-day and \$66.95 per full day; and emergency response services shall be reimbursed \$46.35 per installation and testing and \$46.35 for monthly usage.
