House Bill 483 of the 131st General Assembly transferred responsibility for implementing the Early Intervention program from the Ohio Department of Health to the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities and charged the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities with adopting rules necessary to implement the program.

The rule establishes minimum qualifications through credentialing standards for Early Intervention Service Coordinators and Early Intervention Service Coordination Supervisors.

Persons wanting to work as Early Intervention Service Coordinators or Early Intervention Service Coordination Supervisors must submit an application with supporting documentation to demonstrate that they meet the requirements and complete training to obtain and renew the credentials. The time associated with

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submitting an application will vary by applicant depending on factors such as the number of documents that must be submitted. Holders of the credentials are required to complete professional development (on average, 10 hours per year) to renew the credentials. The Department will provide web-based training modules in the specified topics at no cost to participants. Beyond the specified topics, holders of credentials may incur a cost for completing professional development.
