The Department is amending the rule to increase the rates paid to providers of Homemaker/Personal Care and to clarify the definition of "onsite/on-call."

Medicaid. The rule requires a provider of services to maintain service documentation. These activities consume applicant/provider resources, the cost of which varies by applicant/provider and is unknown to the Department. Paragraphs (C) and (F) require persons providing the service to be trained. Training consumes staff resources and there may be a cost associated with obtaining the training from another entity. Paragraph (D)(1) requires a provider of services to participate in Individual Service Plan (ISP) development meetings when requested by the individual receiving services. Time spent by providers in ISP meetings varies, cannot be billed to a Home and Community-Based Services waiver, and is unknown to the Department.
