The Department is amending the rule to remove redundant training requirements for staff who provide Homemaker/Personal Care.

7. Summarize the rule's content, and if this is an amended rule, also summarize the rule's changes.

The rule defines Homemaker/Personal Care and sets forth provider qualifications, requirements for service delivery and documentation of services, and payment

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standards for the service. The rule is being amended to eliminate paragraphs (C)(5) and (C)(6) because the training described therein is addressed in new rules 5123-2-08 (Provider Certification - Agency Providers) and 5123-2-09 (Provider Certification - Independent Providers). Additional amendments are being made to update citations to administrative rules and eliminate paragraph (F)(13).

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The rule requires a person or agency seeking approval to provide Homemaker/ Personal Care to submit an application to the Department and have a Medicaid provider agreement with the Ohio Department of Medicaid. The rule requires a provider of services to maintain service documentation. These activities consume applicant/provider resources, the cost of which varies by applicant/provider and is unknown to the Department. Paragraph (D)(1) requires a provider of services to participate in Individual Service Plan (ISP) development meetings when requested by the individual receiving services. Time spent by providers in ISP meetings varies, cannot be billed to a Home and Community-Based Services waiver, and is unknown to the Department.
