For the remainder of SFY 22 the estimated cost is \$200,000. For SFY 23 the increased expenditures are a result of the service that is a part of the OhioRISE program being implemented beginning July 1, 2022. The impact of OhioRISE will be \$317 million in FY23. Specialized services for OhioRISE will cost an additional \$265M in SFY 2023. The administrative costs of implementing OhioRISE are \$52 million in SFY 2023.
